

Dr. Hargreaves will inform you when these transactions are concluded.

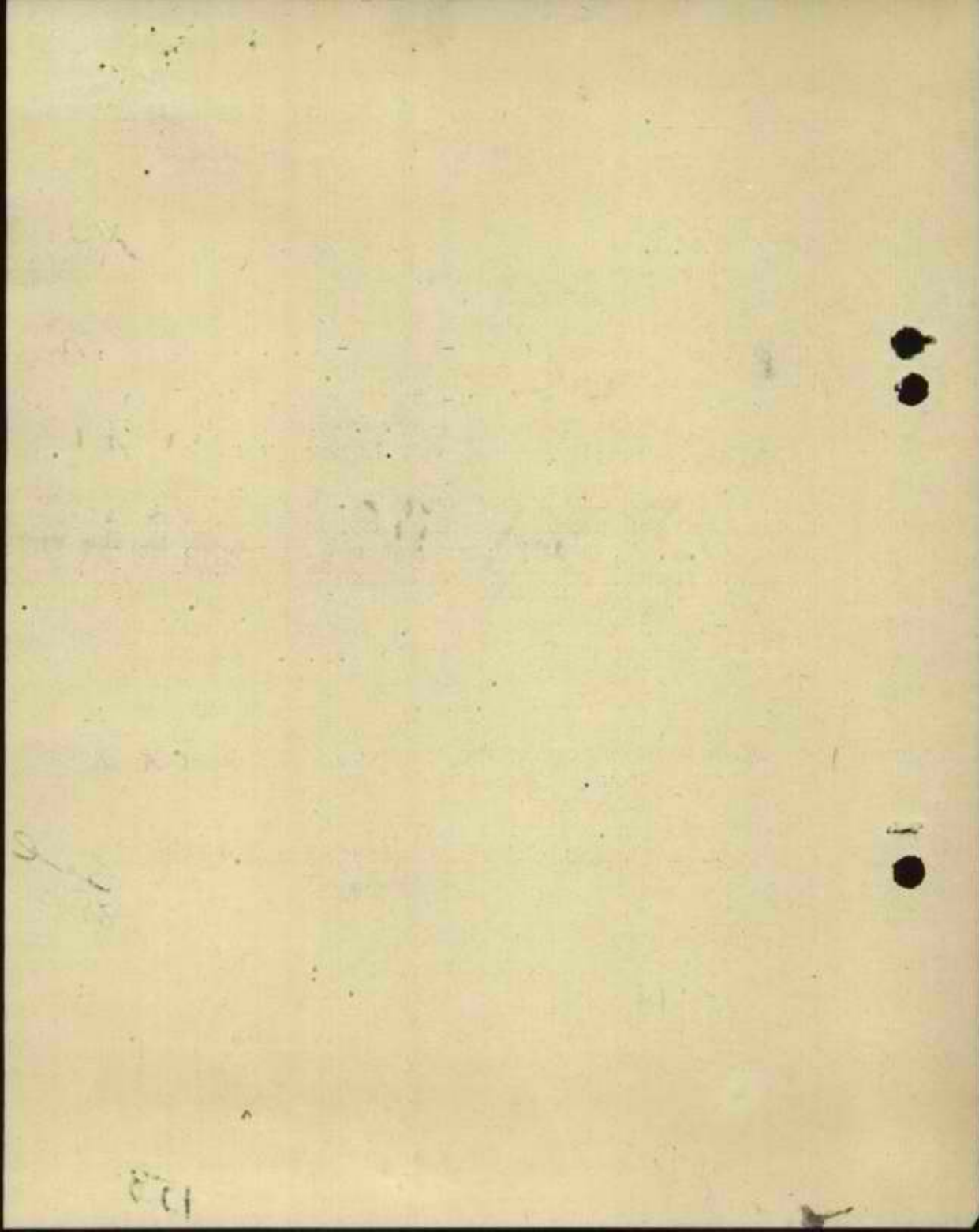



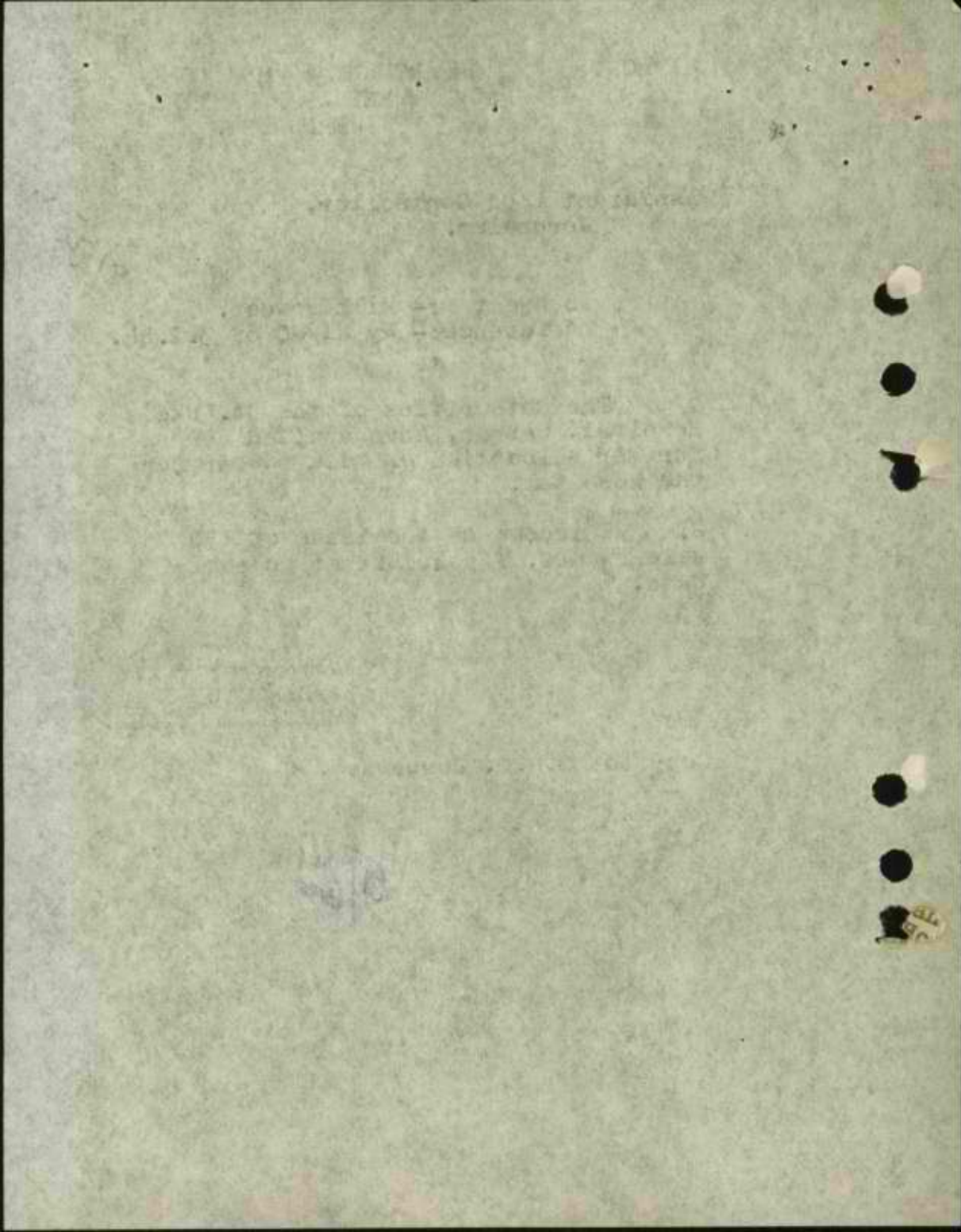

Reference:- Your 16/25 dated 12-5-42.

In regard to St. Luke's Hospital accepting at a fixed rate treatment of indigent persons in Hebron, experience of Hebron forces me to entertain the idea that unless the applicant can produce some quid pro quo to whoever he applies for a certificate for treatment in St. Luke's Hospital, he finds himself relegated to the free clinics held in the Government Quarantine Centre.

With equal cynicism, I can envisage, quite affluent people, imposing on this generosity, to evade the payment of just hospital dues to St. Luke's.

There is no need for a special case to be made of this, as obviously the Municipality is imposing on St. Luke's and Government have already laid down the charges to be paid by public bodies for treatment in such private institutions.

I went to Hebron to discuss this with Dr. Walker but he was not in Hebron, but have communicated my views to the A.D.C. Mr. Somerville, i.e. that the Hebron Municipality pay according to the number of patients admitted and at the above stated rates. Mr. Somerville will communicate this ruling to both Dr. Walker and the Municipality.

SENIOR MEDICAL OFFICER.

I enclose a copy of a letter submitted to me by Mr. Somerville from the Medical Superintendent of St. Luke's Hospital, Hebron. In view of the fact that Government has a government clinic in Hebron for people to go to and they are treated free, it is clear the poorest classes are provided for. As responsible for the finances of the Hebron Municipality, it is clearly against government policy that undue advantage of St. Luke's Hospital should be taken, and that uneconomic rates for services to the people of Hebron should be paid by the Council which form not a help but an embarrassment to that institution; e.g. it appears essential that the public ~~should~~ there for treatment and ~~should~~ pay for their medicines and also that an economic rate should be paid for in-patients.

who go/

2. All these however are technical matters about which I do not feel competent to express an opinion. I suggest therefore that in view of your long experience in hospital administration, your advice should be sought as it will prove of undoubted value in reaching a solution of the problem.

3. In these circumstances, I would suggest that you first have a preliminary talk with Dr. Walker and then you, the Assistant District Commissioner and a deputation of the Council should determine what rates should be paid in the future. As I have already your consent to this proposal, I am sending a copy of this letter to you to Mr. Somerville and shall be grateful if you will arrange the matter direct with him.

Dear Mr. Somerville,

You may recall that several months ago I spoke to you about the hospital arrangements with the Municipality concerning their sending to us poor patients for examination, treatment and provision of medicine in the out-patient and in-patient department.

The agreement made six or seven years ago was that a) the hospital reserve five beds for poor Municipal patients

b) examination, treatment and medicine for 40 out-patients weekly

c) this agreement be for the object of treating the poor (the municipality being better acquainted with the material state of each family than the Doctor or the Matron). Each poor patient brings a paper from the Municipality and by this means, no man, woman or child who is genuinely unable to pay anything should come without such a paper. All who come without a paper are expected to pay the recognised fee.

d) for this the Municipality pays the hospital L.R. 7.500 monthly. This naturally is not expected to cover any X-Ray examination, surgical operation or expensive medicine which of course we pay for.

Since my first talk with you I have not raised the question again lest I should be guilty of asking more, inconsiderately or raising again a question of which I had insufficient experience.

The figures for the past nine months are as follows:

The paper brought from the Municipality states - so I see - that the complete thing is their charity and their's alone Viz ' on the account of the Municipality '.

During these past nine months we have been paid by the Municipality L.R. 67.500 for 979 bed-days and 1,400 out-patients. This payment or contribution works out at 69 mils per in-patient per day and nothing for the 40 out-patients a week.

The inclusive cost of this hospital (other than the missionaries' salaries, which obviously in such a hospital cannot be paid for by the patients) is approximately 330 mils per in-patient per day and 80 mils per out-patient per time. By reason of the grant given by the Bishop the cost to the patient is cut to approx. 220 mils per in-patient per day and for the out-patient 55 mils per patient per time.

Bearing in mind all other sources of hospital income such as radiological examination, surgical operations etc., payment by Government for typhoid patients I reckon that 150 mils per patient per day is just sufficient to cover the costs.

Patients frequently come and when the fee is charged say that they will bring Municipal papers which will entitle them to free treatment the Municipality paying the full cost as the paper declares whereas in reality the Municipality is only paying a mere pittance viz., 1/6 for in-patients and nothing for out-patients and reckoning that the Bishop's grant goes to help even the Municipal patients then it still leaves them paying for in-patients 1/5-1/4 and nothing for out-patients.

Besides this we bear the cost for all poor patients outside the Municipality who are admitted free or for nominal

fee and we are glad to do so and for things such as this the Bishop give the grant.

It seems rather unfair that some come bringing papers when they can pay part if not all and thus defeating the whole object of the plan by depriving others from the weekly quota and depriving the hospital of the usual fee.

You know that we are not out for material gain even by the very fact of our presence in such a town but to help the sick and the contributors at home are glad that by what they give, the poor here can be treated and cared for. It is the greater shame therefore that the rich should try and take an advantage and that the Municipality should advertise a 1/6 truth that they pay the cost.

I mentioned these things to the Bishop a few days ago and he left the matter with me with a suggestion which I pass on to you viz., that the Municipality an 'economic rate', but requesting that this should not be pushed if the time is not opportune.

I should be very grateful to you, after your kind perusal of this letter, to call on you at a time convenient to yourself to receive your advice and help that we may continue the work with efficiency and without ill-feeling being caused to any and without having to raise unduly the fees for all outside the town in order that the fee for the townfolk may be kept low.



For some time the question of hospital staff holidays has perplexed me, for with only one doctor and one matron composing the European staff, and a small nursing staff it is extremely difficult in the summer when 15-20% of the staff is away at any one time for a period of six months.

Finally we came to the conclusion that for the best all round work it would be better that the hospital be closed for the whole month of May. I proposed the matter to the Bishop who agreed with the suggestion requesting only that I put the matter to you as the Senior Medical Officer lest by closing the hospital we put the Public Health Authorities to any serious inconvenience.



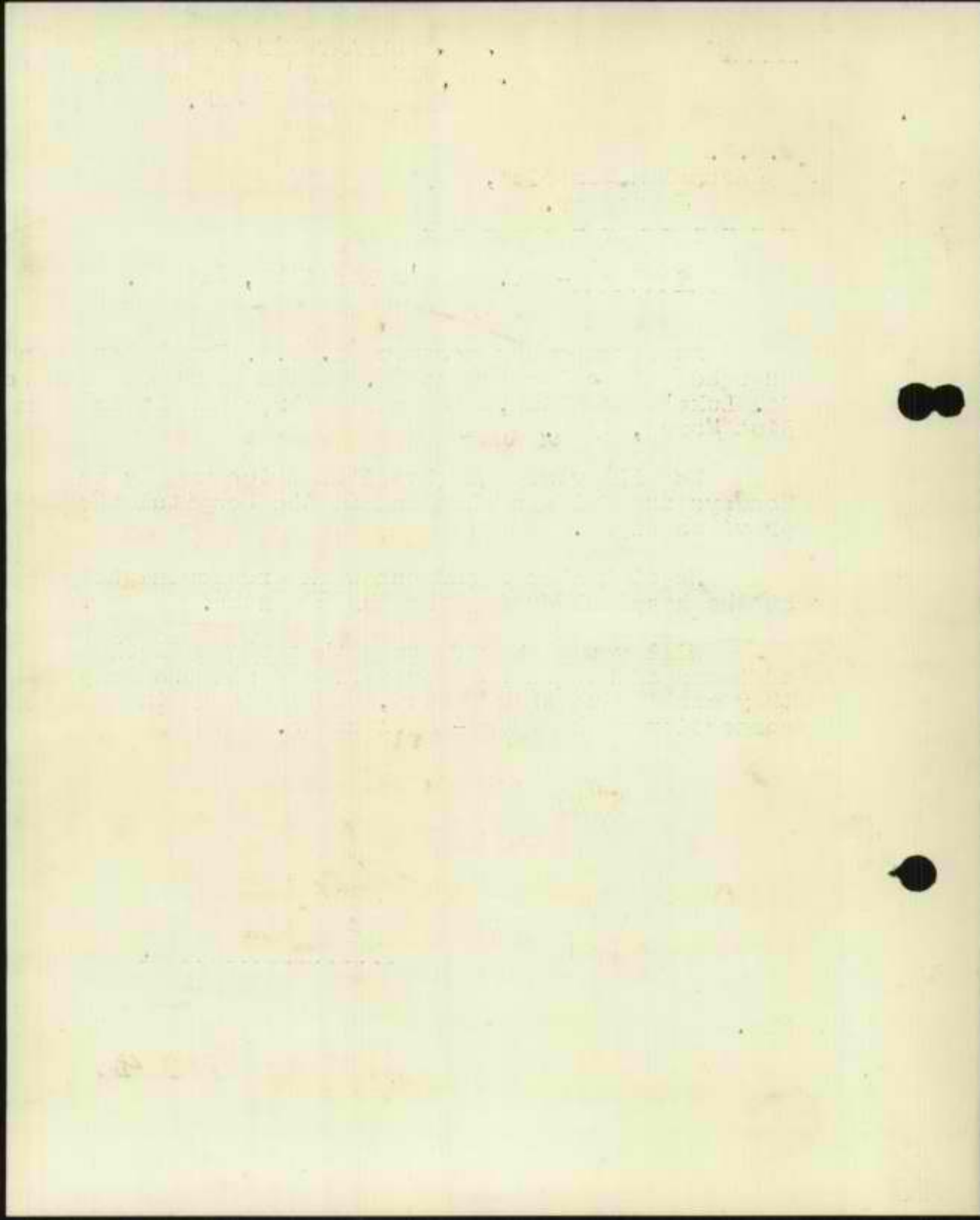



It is regretted that no arrangements are permissible for the payment of an annual grant to St. Luke's Hospital or of fees for typhoid patients as suggested.

2. All voluntary hospitals are expected to deal with a proportion of enteric and dysentery patients as part of their normal work in Palestine.

3. To create a precedent of payment in the case of one hospital would involve the Department in similar claims throughout the country. Recommendations involving such grants cannot, therefore, be submitted for consideration.

4. The Government has considered the policy of giving recurrent grants to voluntary hospitals in the past and has decided against such a policy. Capital grants have in certain exceptional cases been favourably considered, and the St. Luke's Hospital has already benefitted by a grant of £P.1000.

5. St. Luke's Hospital was recommended for a further grant in recent years but the circumstances prevailing in the country led to the cancellation of this and other grants which had received provisional approval.

6. When such grants may again become possible the claims of St. Luke's will be borne in mind.

7. In order to relieve the hospital from typhoid cases from villages you should wherever possible make a special effort to transfer these to Jerusalem if the condition of the patient permits.

I regret to trespass upon your valuable time but I am anxious to raise the problem of the hospitalisation of typhoid patients in this district.

It often happens that typhoid patients are brought to this hospital by officials of the Health Department but the same patients state explicitly that they are unwilling to pay even the smallest fee. As a charitable institution, the hospital is scarcely justified in refusing such patients, but at the same time it often ~~imposed~~ suffers from such cases a financial burden it can very ill afford.

It appears to me reasonable that if the Government enforces hospitalisation for typhoid cases, and if it cannot itself provide the necessary accommodation, that it should be prepared to give financial help to any independent institution cooperating in the hospitalisation of such cases.

If you in any way agree with me in principle, I should be very grateful, Sir, if you would bring the matter before the Director of Medical Services.


With reference to your letter of the 12th instant, I am glad to know the work at the Hebron Hospital is proceeding well.

The Department of Health pay an inclusive fee of 175 mils a day for the treatment of patients given 3rd class accommodation in voluntary hospitals. The doctor at the Hospital should obtain a Hospital Admission Order from the Medical Officer of Health in respect of each government patient and when a patient is discharged from Hospital he should forward Form O.M.275 (of which I enclose a supply) in duplicate and with the upper part of the form completed and signed, to the M.O.H. The fee of 175 mils is inclusive and an increase is not made for operation cases.

I regret there is no suitable sterilizer available in the Medical Stores which can be sent on loan to the Hebron Hospital.

Dr. Abdel Al has already been asked to try to arrange the repair of the road and I understand you are willing, if necessary, to expend not more than EP.10 on the work, if free labour cannot be obtained.
